


Dear Paavo,

Mrs. Tengström, your mother called me yesterday from Finland. She liked us to know that you are studying Finnish at the Suomi College in Michigan and possibly could continue your studies there, until to the end of next spring. Anyway, the University of Jyväskylä and especially the Faculty of Social Sciences is willing to know, when you really will start your studies. So, would you like to write a letter to our university, telling us, how long you are going to defer starting your studies here. You can send the letter to our office, Office for Study Affairs.

I inquired also the Office of the Faculty of Social Sciences about your matter. The Study Secretary of the Faculty told me that it could be quite hard to start in the beginning of next year. The basic courses have been already lectured, for example. Therefore, they recommended you to defer your right to study for the next autumn term. One point is, that your faculty, the Faculty of Social Sciences highly stresses that students have command of Finnish. So, for your own sake it could be useful to end your Finnish studies in USA!

Anyway, when ever you have planned to start your studies, our university should know that. And more one thing: The Student Union has to know one month before, if a foreign student is going to need a flat at the Student Village (if you are going to stay there).
