

Minor Planet Tengström 2195

Discovered on 27 September 1941 by L. Oterma at Turku-Åbo, Finland.

This minor planet was named in honour of Erik Tengström, emeritus profesor at the University of Uppsala, Sweden; on the occasion of his 70th birthday in 1983. Initiator of the study of modern geodesy at Uppsala University, he directed research in a wide number of subjects to include astronomy. One of his ancestors, Jacob Tengström, whom lived in Turku- Åbo served as vice chancellor of the old Academia Aboensis (1803-1817) and as the first Archbishop of Finland (1817-1832).
